



Introduction

Welcome to Athelstaneford the birthplace of Scotland's flag.

We hope you and your class will enjoy your visit to Athelstaneford in East Lothian. The village is easily accessed from the AI and it is signposted at the BI347 turn-off a mile to the east of Haddington. The Flag Heritage Centre lies within the Churchyard on the north side of the main street, where there is ample on-street parking. The Centre is open daily between I0.00am and 5.00pm from April to September. Admission is free.
