

# The Dunbar Film Society

## Where and When?

The film society screens a fixed programme of films for its members and for visitors on the last Friday of every month (July and December excluded).

Screenings are at 8 pm, but you can arrive earlier to enjoy a drink from the bar from 7.30 pm (alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks may be taken in to the screening).

The venue for this fixed programme is the Hallhill Healthy Living Centre, Dunbar. Extra children, family and community events in other Dunbar venues will be advertised separately - look out for our posters!

## How?

Membership can be purchased at any screening.

### Individual membership only:

**£20 (12 months) or £10 (6 months)**

### Shared membership only:

**£25 (12 months)**

(Shared membership entitles one person entry per screening)

Entry on the door for visitors is **£5 per person**. If you enjoy the experience you can obtain membership on the night by paying the balance of the membership fee.

Members are able to attend the AGM, join the committee and generally get involved with the activities of the society.

Children/family events are charged on a per film basis for members and non-members at the person/family rate advertised.
