

What kind of East Lothian do you want in 10 years' time? Have your say now on the future of East Lothian

East Lothian Council is seeking your views on future land-use and development in East Lothian. The Council is in the early stages of preparing a new Local Development Plan. This will be a new land-use plan that will eventually replace the existing East Lothian Local Plan 2008. At this stage we are interested in hearing the views of everyone with an interest in East Lothian. We want to know what aspirations you have for the way your area might develop over the next ten years or so, and what planning issues you think may need to be addressed in the new plan.

A series of events has been arranged to gather your views. These will be run independently by Planning Aid for Scotland (PAS), an impartial, charitable organisation that helps people have their say in the planning system. The views gathered will help the Council prepare a document called the Main Issues Report, which will then be published for consultation later in 2012.
