Many of our upcoming activities and events are shown on the Tynninghame Village Hall website. This website also includes a calendar showing the events booked at the Hall. It also allows you to make bookings for the hall as resident at reduced rates.

If you would like to receive our Mailchimp newsletter there is a page on the website that you can fill in to be included on the mailing list and we will make sure when we produce this that you get a copy. The website explains how you can get involved in activities in and around the Village Hall.

At the moment we have a walking group, a craft and connect group, a singing group and we are just starting a local history group. In the coming months there are plans to establish new activities such as a regular table tennis session in the hall and croquet matches. The Hall provides the facility for regular yoga and fitness classes as well as dog training. These sessions are run by local individuals and details along with charges can be found on the Website. There is a Craft Fair held on the last Sunday of every month, you will spot the banners going up for the "Wee Fair" in the days leading up to this.

In addition to the Website, the Village Bus Shelter and the notice board on the Main Street contains both a map of the village and will contain, at times, information of significance. The Bus Shelter operates as a hub.

Book and CD Swap - there is a repository for books and CD's in the Shelter and this is maintained by hall volunteers. We are also collecting the plastic lids from milk bottles for the charity, Borders General Hospital, and the bucket for these is in the shelter.

A Defibrillator for emergency use is situated on the external rear wall of the Village Hall which can be accessed by the lane on the right-hand side.

We are a group of people supported by TVHCC who arrange activities in Tynninghame and the Village Hall and participation is open to any resident.

### **Tynninghame Community WhatsApp:**

This WhatsApp group is for Tynninghame village residents to share news and information relevant to the community, it is also where you can seek support or advice e.g. if you need a hand with shopping or you need a short term borrowing of something like a high chair or if you just want some guidance on the current Covid situation or similar, you can also offer items for free or to rehome or to put items up for sale or exchange.

### **Tynninghame -A Conservation Village**

In 1969, Tynninghame was designated a conservation village. Today, Tynninghame is an historic village of local architectural importance, with many of the buildings now having 'listed' status. The Tynninghame Estate still owns and manages some properties and grass areas In the Village. However, some of these are now privately owned or due for sale.

There is both a Cricket and Football pitch available for use at the back of the Village Hall. These are currently owned by the Estate.

We are lucky to be surrounded by beautiful countryside with The John Muir Way nearby and locally you are able also to walk around 'The Ladies Walk'. Details of some walks are available on the website. Just a word of warning there is no pavement on the A198 towards the road to access Tynninghame beach. The car park is Pay and Display, but Coastal car parking permits can be bought from East Lothian council.

Properties in the Village come under planning restrictions and building control. such as specific paint colours.

As the Village has no shops you will find post office, medical centre, chemist, butcher, groceries, paper shop, hairdressers, and library etc in East Linton.
